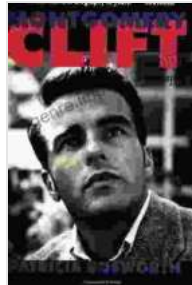

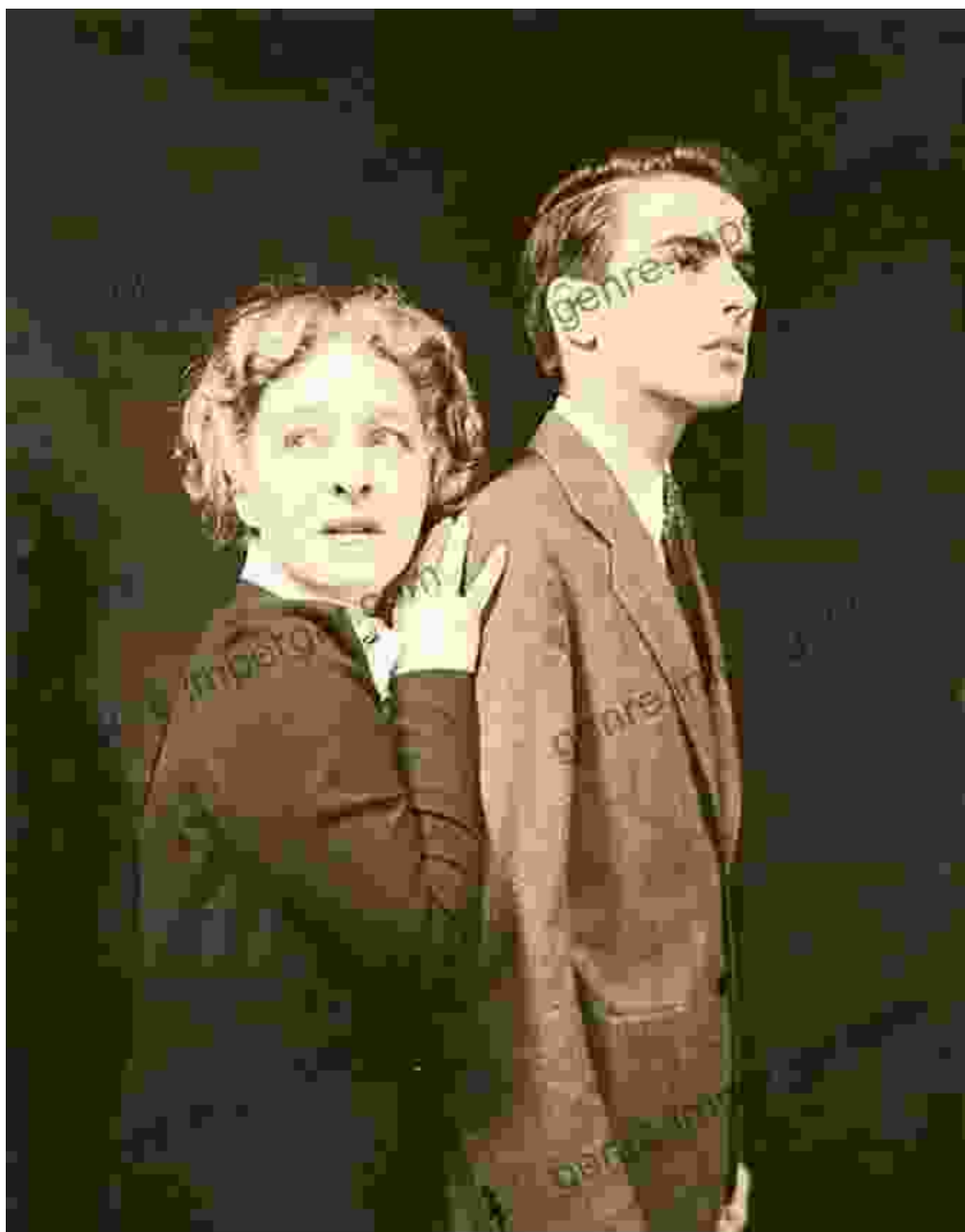

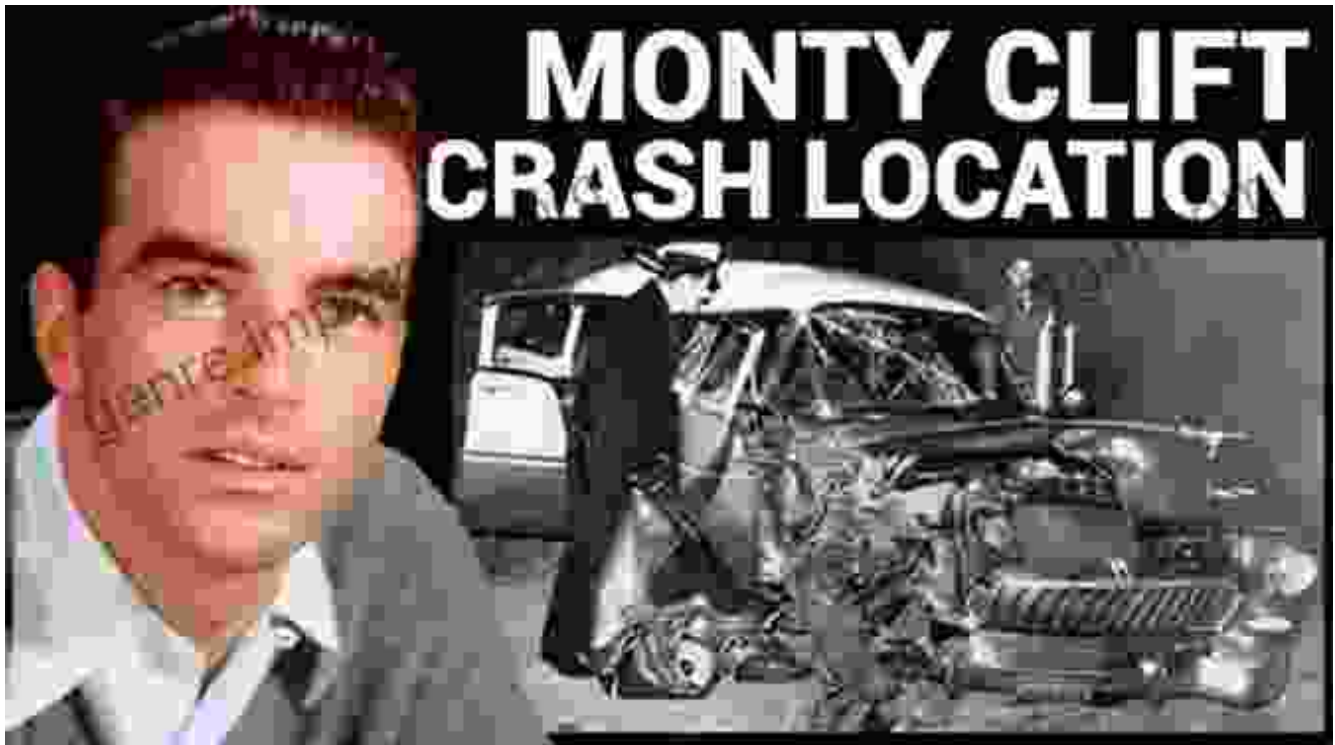
Montgomery Clift in the film Red River

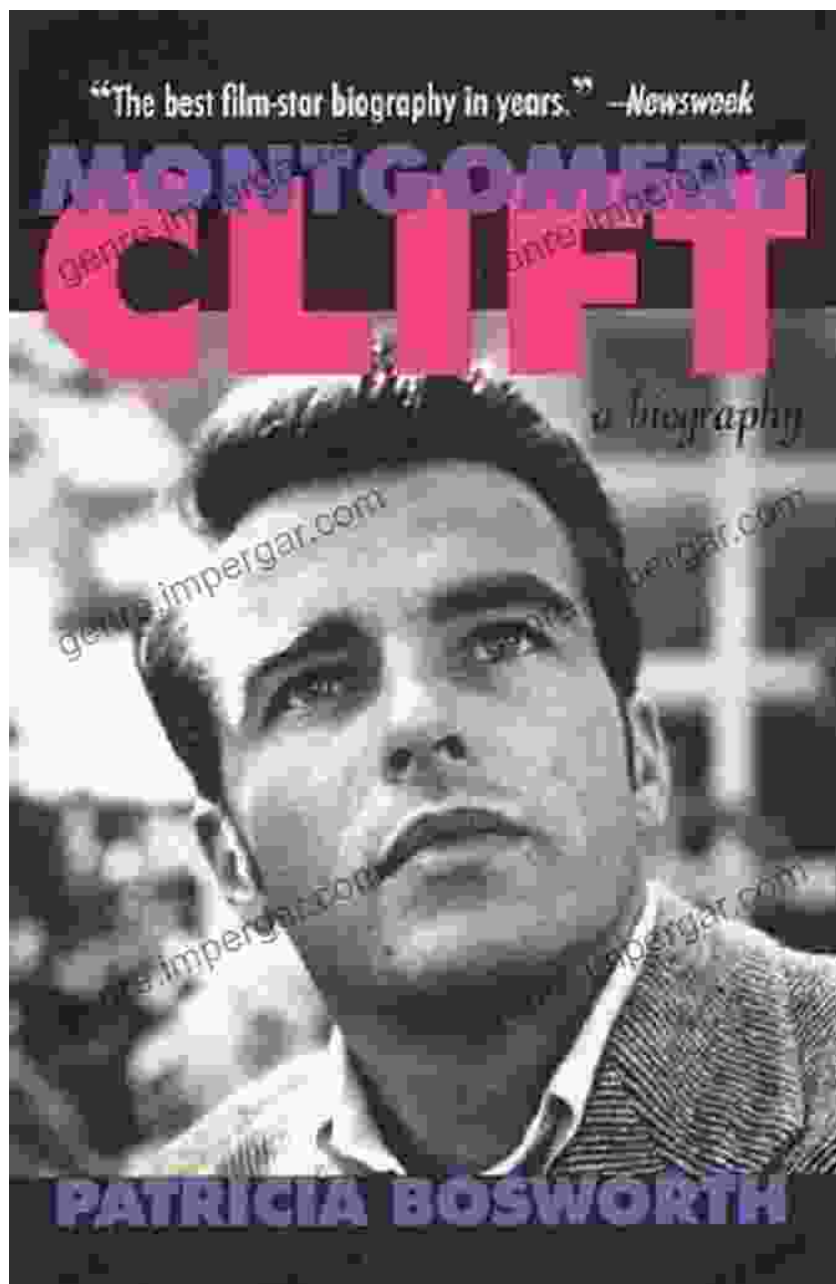

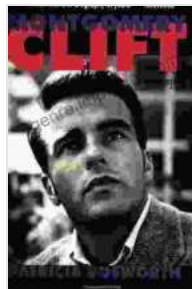

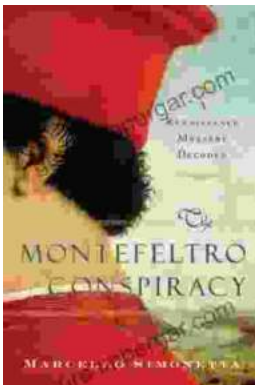
