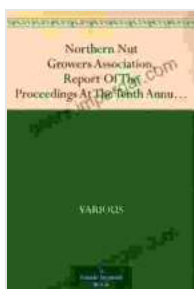

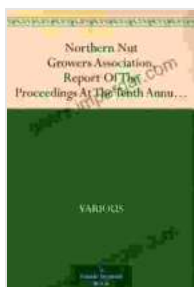
Latest Research Findings

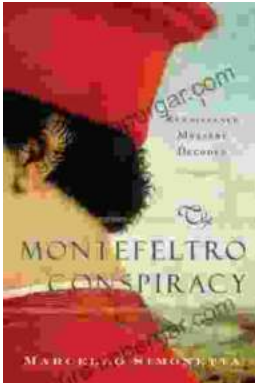
